#### **Assessment Tasks**

#### **Participation**

This unit forms part of the sequence of units comprising the Honours thesis in the Faculty of Information Technology and allows students who have been delayed in their studies time to complete their thesis.

FIT4000 Honours Thesis Extension is taken over a single semester but forms the final part of a sequence of units that together allow a student to complete an Honours Thesis of 24 or 18 cpts.

These units include:

- FIT4441 Honours Thesis Part 1
- FIT4442 Honours Thesis Part 2
- FIT4443 Honours Thesis Part 3
- FIT4444 Honours Thesis Final (24 cpts) or FIT4448 Honours Thesis Final (18 cpts)

At the completion of the requirements for the thesis the following components of assessment will be completed:

- Research Proposal: (approximately 3000 words) 5%;
- Literature Review: (approximately 6000 words) 10%:
- Interim Presentation: hurdle;
- Final Presentation: 5%:
- Thesis (normally 10,000 20,000 words): 80%

#### The following components will be assessed during the course of this unit:

The student will be required to complete any outstanding assessment items, normally these will consist of the Final Presentation: 5%; Thesis (normally 10,000 - 20,000 words): 80%
